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**PLC Overview & Governance** 

#### About the PLC

Since 1995 the PLC has been the voice of the logging industry in Maine, and in 2023, the organization expanded to represent timber harvesting and hauling businesses in the Northeast. The PLC is the region's only trade organization which exists to give independent logging contractors and sole proprietors a voice in the rapidly changing forest industry. Our Board is made up entirely of loggers, making us a logging organization that is run by loggers for loggers.

From the outset, PLC has focused on logger advocacy, safety, quality operations and business innovation. Our members realize that harvesting is more than just cutting trees. They are highly skilled, business professionals and are an integral part of the region's economic engine. Our members do their best in the woods and are committed to excellence in the logging industry, "Professional Loggers".

The PLC of the Northeast partners with the American Loggers Council, Forest Resources Association, the Maine Motor Transport Association to ADVOCATE being a voice in Augusta, Montpelier and Washington DC that speaks for Loggers. COMMUNICATE the message that logging is good for everyone. Harvesting trees provides jobs for millions of Americans and working forests are essential for a healthy environment, providing clean air, clean water, and wildlife habitat. CULTIVATE relationships in the business community to provide members with a competitive edge. INNOVATE by helping our members create opportunities to position them competitively in the marketplace and COLLABORATE to work with other forest industry groups on issues where we agree, but standing strong for loggers when we don't.

In 2000, the PLC created the world's first 3rd party certification program, Northeast Master Logger® Certification. Today, the Northeast Master Logger program is represented in 20 states and 3 countries. The PLC is also a founding member of the American Loggers Council (ALC) and works with the ALC to influence federal legislation. This includes increasing the weight limit on I-95 north of Augusta to 100,000 pounds. In Maine the PLC has been responsible for giving loggers tax exempt status for parts & equipment and for securing funding for the state's first post-secondary mechanized harvest operator training program.



#### PLC Mission:

Promote logging as a profession, advocate for logging professionals, cultivate responsible forest management, promote safe working practices and sustain a strong forest products industry. Innovative and creative, and are always developing new ways to overcome obstacles.

#### PLC Vision:

The Northeast's loggers are well qualified to meet future challenges. They have a tremendous work ethic, a diverse set of skills, many years of experience, exceptional problem-solving abilities, perseverance; are innovative and creative, and are always developing new ways to overcome obstacles.

#### Northeast Master Logger® Certification & TCNEF



The Trust to Conserve Northeast Forestlands (TCNEF) is a 501(c)3, non-profit conservation organization, dedicated to supporting exemplary forest professionals; acknowledging those who are highly trained and open to third party certification; and increasing partnerships by acknowledging common goals among landowners, loggers, foresters, and ecologists.

TCNEF was formed by the Professional Logging Contractors of Maine in 2003 to administer the Maine Master Logger® Certification (MLC)

Program®. In 2007 the Maine program merged with the Southern New England program to become the Northeast Master Logger® Certification Program and now serves the six New England States and New York. Northeast MLC has been recognized by industry, government and the end-users of forest products as a rigorous and credible system for the independent, third-party certification of harvest practices.

In addition to the Northeast Master Logger® Program, TCNEF serves as an administrator for a group Forest Stewardship Council® (FSC®) Chain of Custody certification as well as an FSC-certified group certificate for Forest Management. Under this group arrangement, logging companies can inexpensively gain access to FSC markets. These certifications serve to provide market-based recognition for loggers practicing sustainable and ecologically responsible forest management practices.

These efforts were initiated by forest products harvesters. They have demonstrated, through the success and growth of the Northeast Master Logger® Certification program, their keen interest in transforming a primarily extractive industry into a productive use of forest resources that supports the longevity of a unique profession, the survival of rural communities and is accountable to any concerns about environmental and ecological integrity that may be encountered.

#### Ted Wright, Executive Director TCNEF

Ted Wright is the Executive Director of the Trust To Conserve Northeast Forestlands (TCNEF), he joined the organization in 2015. TCNEF oversees the Northeast Master Logger® Certification program and manages Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certificates for landowners and loggers. Mr. Wright currently sits on the FSC-US Board of Directors in the social chamber, which allows him to advocate for loggers and rural communities on forest certification issues.

Mr. Wright grew up in Aroostook County on a potato farm in Littleton, ME within sight of the Canadian border. #### **PLC Bylaws**

PROFESSIONAL LOGGING CONTRACTORS of the Northeast

ARTICLE I: NAME and PURPOSE

Section 1:

Name The name of this organization shall be the PROFESSIONAL LOGGING

CONTRACTORS of the Northeast.

Section 2: **Purpose** The PROFESSIONAL LOGGING CONTRACTORS of the Northeast (PLC-NE) is an organization representing independent logging and forest products trucking contractors formed to:

Promote professional conduct among loggers in the northeastern United States.

Provide a forum for the resolution of issues of concern to logging contractors through advocacy, communication, education, and legislation.

Promote compliance with forestry and harvesting practices which maintain sustainable forestry levels.

Promote safe work practices to lower risk and increase profitability on behalf of its members.

ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: **Members** Members of the PLC-NE shall be logging contractors, affiliated contractors, and forest contractors in the northeastern United States that are primarily engaged in harvesting, processing, chipping, grinding, road building and transportation of/for forest products. All contractor members must maintain current workers' compensation insurance. Logging contractors, whose businesses are primarily engaged in timber harvesting and are responsible for harvesting operations from stump to roadside, are board eligible, have voting rights and can take advantage of all of the PLC's member benefits.

**Affiliated contractors and forest contractors** are not board eligible, do have voting rights and can take advantage of PLC's member only benefits.

**Supporting Members** Supporting Members of the PLC-NE shall be value added processing mills, land management companies, vendors and associated businesses that sell products and services to the industry. Supporting Members are not board eligible, do not have voting rights and cannot take advantage of the PLC's member only benefits.



Section 2: **Qualifications** To qualify as a member, a contracting firm must satisfy the PLC-NE that its goals and objectives are primarily directed at the benefit and enhancement of independent logging businesses that are primarily engaged in the harvesting, processing, chipping, grinding, road building and transportation of/for forest products. As a condition of membership, a qualifying member must agree to meet or exceed the standards and principals within PLC-NE's "Logger's Code of Practice". The PLC-NE may also from time to time require Members to comply with certain conditions of membership which are aligned with professional conduct. Where there are questions about membership, a contractor may petition the PLC-NE on a case by case basis.

Section 3: **Dues** Dues and assessments, if any, may be established by majority vote of the Board of Directors.

Section 4: **Application for Membership** All applications for membership must be submitted on a form provided by the PLC-NE.

Section 5: **Annual Meetings** The annual meeting of the Members shall be held on the 1st Friday in May at a time and place designated in the notice of the meeting. At such annual meeting, the Members shall elect a Board of Directors, consider reports of the affairs of the organization and transact such other business as may be properly brought before the meeting.

Section 6: **Special Meetings** Special meetings of the Members may be called at any time by the President, a majority of the Board of Directors, or by the Secretary at the request of not less than one-fourth (1/4) of the Members entitled to vote at such meeting.

Section 7: **Notice of Meetings** Written notice of each annual and special meeting of Members stating the place, date and hour of the meeting, and, in the case of a special meetings, the purpose for which the meeting is called, shall be given to each Member of record entitled to vote thereat no less than ten (10) days before the date of the meeting, either personally, or by first class mail. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be timely delivered if deposited in the United States mail, addressed to the Member at his or her address as it appears in the records of the organization, with postage prepaid, at least three (3) days before such notice is due.

Section 8: **Quorum** A majority of the members entitled to vote, present in person or represented by proxy, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business of all Members' meetings. If a quorum shall not be present or represented by proxy, a majority of the Members present in person or represented by proxy, may adjourn the

meeting from time to time without further notice until a quorum shall be present in person or represented by proxy. At such later meeting at which a quorum shall be presented or represented by proxy, any business may be transacted that might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called. The Members present at a duly called meeting may continue to transact business until adjournment, notwithstanding the withdrawal of enough Members to result in less than a quorum. If a quorum is present, the affirmative vote of a majority of the Members represented at the meeting and voting on the subject matter shall be the act of the Members, unless the vote of a greater number is required by these Bylaws.

Section 9: **Proxies** Each person entitled to vote at a Members' meeting, or entitled to execute a written consent authorizing action in lieu of a meeting, may do so either in person or by proxy executed in writing by the member or by his duly authorized attorney in fact. No proxy shall be valid after eleven (11) months from the date of its execution.

Section 10: **Vote** Each contractor Member shall be entitled to one (1) vote in the affairs of the PLC-NE.

Section 11: **Action by Members Without a Meeting** Any action required or permitted to be taken at a Members' meeting may be taken without a meeting if a written consent setting forth the action so taken is signed by all Members entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof. Any such consent shall be inserted in the minute book as if it were the minutes of a Members' meeting.

Section 12: **Telephonic Meeting** The Members may participate in a meeting of the Members by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, during which meeting all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at a meeting.

#### ARTICLE III: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1: **Number/Term** The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than twenty (20) from Maine, three (3) from VT and no more than two (2) from other states in the northeast. A Director's term shall be for no more than three (3) years.

Section 2: **Authority** The Board of Directors shall establish policy and direct the affairs of the PLC-NE. There shall be no alternates/substitutes for members of the Board of Directors at any of their meetings.

Section 3: **Powers** The business and affairs of the organizations shall be managed by the Board of Directors which shall exercise or direct the exercise of all powers except to the



extent member authorizations is specifically required by law or by these Bylaws. The Board of Directors shall be the final authority on all matters regarding membership.

Section 4: **Place of Meeting** Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at such place or places as may be designated from time to time by the Board of Directors or as shall be specified in the notice of any such meeting.

Section 5: **Annual Meeting** The Board of Directors shall meet for the election of officers and the transaction of other business, immediately after each annual meeting of the Members, on the same day and at the same place where such annual meeting shall be held. Notice of such meeting need not be given. In the event such meeting is not so held, the annual meeting of the Board of Directors may be held at such other time or place as shall be specified in a notice thereof give as provided in Section 8 of this Article III.

Section 6: **Regular Meetings** Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at such time and place as the Board of Directors may set. Notice of regular meetings of the Board of Directors need not be given except as otherwise specifically required by law or by these Bylaws.

Section 7: **Special Meetings** Special meetings of the Board of Directors for any purpose or purposes may be called at any time by the President, or by a majority of the Directors.

Section 8: **Notice of Special Meetings** Written notice of each special Board of Directors meeting shall be given at least ten (10) days before the meeting. Notice shall be deemed given upon receipt, or upon mailing, postage prepaid, at least thirteen (13) days prior to the date of the meeting. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except when a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. The business to be transacted at the special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be specified in the written notice of the meeting.

Section 9: **Quorum** A majority of the number of Directors specified in Article III, Section 1 of these Bylaws shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 10: **Manner of Acting** The action of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the vote of a greater number is required by these Bylaws or by the laws of the State of Maine that govern this organization.

Section 11: Attendance at Board of Director's meetings by PLC Members PLC Board

of Director's meetings may be attended by any PLC member in good standing. However, only elected members of the Board of Directors may vote, as outlined in Article III, Section 2, on any matters before the Board. The Board may at its discretion adjourn into "Executive Session" to discuss confidential matters. At that time, anyone not a member of the Board of Directors will be asked to leave the proceedings until such time as the Executive Session is adjourned.

Section 12: Attendance at PLC Board of Director's meetings by invited guests A member of the PLC Board of Directors may invite a non-PLC member as a guest to a Board of Directors meeting, upon advance notice to PLC Staff. Such notice should be given two (2) weeks in advance of the regularly scheduled quarterly PLC Board of Director's meeting so staff can add the guest to the agenda. Guests may be asked to leave the meeting, should the Board enter into discussion of any matters deemed to be of a confidential, non-public nature.

Section 13: **Board Eligibility** Logging Contractor members, in good standing, is the only level of membership that is board eligible. Logging Contractor members are responsible for harvesting operations from stump to roadside.

#### ARTICLE IV: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1: **Composition** The PLC-ME's Executive Committee shall consist of the four elected officers and the immediate Past President. Executive Committee members must be Board members in good standing.

Section 2: **Authority** The Executive Committee shall have and may exercise the powers of the Board of Directors in the management of the business affairs and property of the PLC-NE during the intervals between meetings of the Board of Directors. Any such action taken by the Executive Committee shall be ratified or rescinded at the next duly held meeting of the Board of Directors. Failure of the Board of Directors to act shall constitute ratification of action by the Executive Committee.

Section 3: **Quorum** Four (4) members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum. In the event of a tie vote, the President's vote shall count twice. No proxy votes will be allowed for determining a quorum or for deciding any matter before the Executive Committee.

#### **ARTICLE V: OTHER COMMITTEES**

Section 1: **Standing Committees** The standing committees of the PLC-NE shall be a Membership Committee and a Nominating Committee. The Board of Directors may designate such other committees as they deem appropriate.



Section 2: **Composition** Composition of all committees shall be appointed by the President and ratified by the Board of Directors at a duly held meeting thereof.

Section 3: **Minutes/Notice** Committee Chairs shall ensure that meeting notices are delivered in a timely fashion ant that minutes are taken, finalized and distributed to the committee Members and to the Board of Directors.

Section 4: **Miscellaneous** The Board of Directors may designate one or more directors as alternate members of any committee, who may replace any absent or disqualified member at any meeting of the committee. Each committee shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. Each committee shall have such name as may be determined from time to time by resolution adopted by the Board of Directors. The designation of any committee and the delegation of authority thereto shall not relieve the Board of Directors, or any member thereof, of any responsibility imposed by law or by these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS

**Section 1: Election and Term** The officers of the PLC-NE shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-Present, Secretary, and Treasurer. They shall each be elected for a two-year term by the Board of Directors at the annual meeting thereof. No officer may serve more than three (3) successive terms.

Section 2: **Qualification** Only Members or employees thereof shall qualify to serve as officers.

Section 3: **Vacancy** In the case of the absence of any officer, or for any other reason the Board of Directors may deem sufficient, the President of the PLC-NE may delegate for the time being the powers or duties of such officer to any other officer or director.

Section 4: **Removal** The Board of Directors at any meeting called for that purpose, may by majority vote of the full Board, remove officers with or without cause.

Section 5: **Resignation** Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice of his/her resignation to the Board of Directors. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time of receipt thereof or at any later time specified therein, and unless specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

Section 6: **Duties of President** The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Members, the Board of Directors, and the Executive Committee. The President shall have all of the general powers and duties which are usually vested in the office of the president of a nonprofit organization.



#### PLC Bylaws, Cont.

Section 7: **Duties of the Vice-Presidents** The Vice-Presidents shall have all of the powers and authority to perform all of the functions and duties of the President, in the absence of the President or in the President's inability for any reason to exercise such powers and functions or perform such duties. The First Vice-President shall assume the President's duties first, and the Second Vice-President shall assume such duties second, if the First Vice-President is unable to perform.

Section 8: **Duties of Secretary** The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all the meetings of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, and the Members. The Secretary shall have charge of such books and records as the Board of Directors may direct; and shall in general perform all of the duties incident to the office of Secretary. The Secretary shall compile and keep up-to-date a complete list of Members and their current addresses and voting rights. Such list shall be open to inspection by all Members and other persons lawfully entitled to inspect the same at reasonable times during regular business hours.

Section 9: **Duties of Treasurer** The treasurer shall have responsibility for funds, shall keep the financial records and books of the account of the organization, and shall be responsible for keeping full and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements in the name and to the credit of the organization in such banks or depositories as may from time to time be designated by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall also keep such books of account as the Board of Directors may direct. A report of the financial condition of the corporation shall be made by the Treasurer to the President whenever requested and a report of like character shall be submitted by the Treasurer at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall also perform such duties as are required by law or by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 10: **Surety Bonds** The Board of Directors may require any officer or agent of the organization to execute a bond in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board may determine, conditioned upon the faithful performance of their duties to the organization, including responsibility for negligence or willful misconduct.

#### ARTICLE VII: INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS AN OFFICERS

Section 1: **Indemnification** The organization shall indemnify every director and officer against all loss, costs and expenses, including Attorneys' fees, reasonably incurred in connection with any action, suit or proceeding to which such person may be made a party by reason of being or having been a director or officer of the organization, except as to matters wherein the officer or director is ultimately adjudged to be liable for gross negligence or willful misconduct.

ARTICLE VIII: ANTITRUST VIOLATIONS PROHIBITED



Section 1: In General Any meeting or other assembly of the PLC-ME may create potential antitrust risks which may provide opportunities for producing illegal agreements. The PLC-NE specifically repudiates any act which may be a violation of antitrust law. All Members, Directors, and Officers are prohibited from initiating or participating in any communication which might be in violation of the antitrust laws. If any Member, Director, or Officer becomes aware that such communications are occurring, he or she must leave the gathering immediately and report the incident to the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE IX: MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1: These Bylaws may be altered, amended, or repealed by a majority vote of the Board of Directors, provided that notice of such proposed amendment or repeal has been given to each Director by mail at least ten (10) days before the meeting.

#### Section 2: Amendment to Bylaws

**Copies of Records** All Members shall have the right to obtain copies of these Bylaws, any and all annual reports, and other financial data pertaining to the organization.

#### Section 3:

Compensation All Directors and Officers shall serve without salary or compensation. Amended BYLAWS adopted this 5th day of May, 2023.

The PLC has a long-term public relations program with the objectives of enhancing the logging industry image, building public acceptance of logging, and providing the facts about our forests.

#### 2022-2023 Annual Report

2022-23 continued a trend that began in 2021 where high inflation, including record high diesel prices, and a lack of consistency with respect to pulp prices continues to wear on the profitability of contractors, and many are leaving or are considering leaving the business as a result. Contractors are a very proud and generous group, and despite the hurdles, they love what they do and will do everything they can to continue their way of life despite the obstacles.

In March of 2023, the PLC published its third economic impact study, "The Economic Contribution of Logging and Trucking in Maine," in conjunction with the University of Maine. The study's findings substantiate what has happened over the last three years because of the impacts of COVID 19 and the shutdown of the digesters at the Jay mill. We are estimating that Maine has lost 30% of its harvesting capacity and the layoff of nearly 1,000 people in harvesting and hauling since 2020. In just four years, the industry has shrunk from an annual economic impact of \$620 million to \$582 million and total jobs have been reduced from 9,000 to 5,500.

Also in March of 2023, the PLC implemented its annual safety training schedule for training more than 1,000 individuals at 11 locations throughout the state. Additionally, because of a new grant from the Maine Community College, the PLC has been able to create a new training database for its membership and will provide free membership dues for any member that sent more than 50% of their staff to a training in 2023.

Safety, training, and loss control are major priorities for the PLC. The PLC's relationship with Acadia Insurance is also a key component of why the PLC is so invested in reducing risk for its membership and ensuring claims are kept at a minimum to help contractors remain profitable. The Acadia Insurance relationship is significant, and it was announced last fall that the Acadia Dividend program provided a dividend check to eligible members for the seventh straight year. \$970,000 was returned to members in 2022 and over \$13 million has been returned to PLC members since the program began in 1999.

In June of 2022, the PLC, in collaboration with the Maine Community College System, kicked off its sixth cohort of the Mechanized Logging Operations Program (MLOP) in Summit, Maine. The program was created thanks to a partnership between three Maine community colleges, the PLC, and industry partners including Milton CAT and United Ag., Construction and Forestry/John Deere. MLOP gives students a broad overview of the most common mechanical systems found in modern timber harvesting equipment, and an understanding of the variables of timber growth, tree species, and markets. It also includes a strong emphasis on safety. The program graduated 10 highly trained students on September 15, 2022.

In late June 2023, the PLC will kick off its seventh cohort, which will mark a major change in the program. The 2023 program will expand to 20 weeks and in addition to the traditional hands-on operations training, all students will now be eligible to obtain their CDL license. The new program will now be called the Mechanized Logging Operations and Forest Trucking Program.

The PLC is in the midst of another busy Legislative session in Augusta in 2023. In addition to advocating for and against legislation that will hurt and help contractors, the PLC also had two priority bills sponsored on behalf of the organization to create a new logger advocate position at the Maine Forest Service (MFS) and to mandate the use of the paper Forest Operations Notification (FONS) in addition to the online system. While the advocate bill was rejected, the paper FONS must now be provided to any contractor that requests it. The current legislative session is expected to adjourn in mid-June 2023.

At the federal level, the PLC has also had a strong impact and invested a significant amount of time and attention on federal policy in the last year. The work of our organization, the American Loggers Council and our colleagues across the country, has led to the reintroduction of Youth in Logging Careers legislation, biomass energy legislation and a bill to eliminate the federal excise tax on newly purchase trucks and trailers.

A special thanks goes to the entire Maine Congressional Delegation, especially Senator Collins and Congressman Golden, for their continued leadership on issues pertaining to loggers and truckers in Maine. Additionally, the PLC's work with the Congressional delegation also led to the appropriation of \$1 million to Northern Maine Community College for the expansion of the already successful program in 2023 and the creation of a new timber hauling Commercial Drivers License (CDL) training program for students. This new funding will double the size of the program in 2024 and 2025. This is timely recognition of all the work that PLC has done to advance this industry.

Organizational membership remains strong as the PLC now has 200 contractor members and 114 supporting members. The financial position of the organization also remains strong. In 2022, the PLC was able to retire the debt on its building in Augusta and has also increased its savings by more than 50% in the last year. The future looks bright for the organization.

And lastly, the PLC has continued its leadership role as the state sponsor of the Log-A-Load for Kids Campaign; since 1995, the PLC has raised \$1.9 million for the cause. At the PLC's 27th Annual Meeting in May 2022, \$144,000 was raised, breaking the all-time annual meeting record of \$94,000 (October 2021). The PLC's golf tournaments in August and September raised more than \$100,000, which was added to the total. The 2021 total for Log A Load was \$205,000 raised and it was announced in early January that the new total for 2022 exceeded \$262,000. In 2023, the PLC will exceed more than \$2 million raised since 1995, and the generosity of Maine loggers never ceases to amaze me. The past year has been the most challenging we have ever seen in our history, but we will get through it and look forward to sustaining one of Maine's legacy industries for the future.



#### LOG A LOAD For Kids



The PLC has been the sponsor of the Log A Load program in Maine since 1996, when PLC's annual Log A Load for Maine Kids golf tournament began. Since 1996, more than \$2.135 million has been raised by the PLC and its partners for this amazing cause.

The PLC and the Northern Light Health Foundation have partnered in the Log A Load fund-raising effort since 1996. Funds have gone to support research and training, purchase equipment, and pay for uncompensated care, all in support of the mission to save and improve the lives of as many children in Maine as possible. Eastern Maine Medical Center in Bangor includes a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit that has received support for years from the PLC's Log A Load efforts.

The PLC holds two Log A Load golf tournaments, a southern tournament at the Kezar Lake Country Club in Lovell, Maine in addition to the northern tournament at JATO Highlands Golf Course in Lincoln, Maine. The PLC partners with the Barbara Bush Children's Hospital (BBCH) and Northern Light Health Foundation to hold the tournaments and an annual auction. BBCH in Portland and Northern Light's Eastern Maine Medical Center in Bangor are both Children's Miracle Network Hospitals.

The South Carolina Forestry Association started the Log A Load for Kids program in 1988. Originally, the concept was for loggers, wood-supplying businesses, and

other industry supporters in various states including Maine to donate the value of a load of logs to their local Children's Miracle Network Hospitals.

Today, Log A Load funds impact more than 60 Children's Miracle Network Hospitals across North America. Hospitals utilize the funds based on what they need the most. Funds are often used to purchase lifesaving equipment, support therapy programs and provide charitable care.



We raised \$60,621 at the

26th Annual Log A Load for Maine Kids Golf Tournament Friday, Sept. 15, 2023 at JATO Highlands Golf Course. The PLC also held its Log A Load for Maine Kids Southern Maine Golf Tournament Friday, Aug. 25 in Lovell, raising \$47,377. The tournaments benefit Children's Miracle Network (CMN) hospitals in Maine, and are the PLC's largest annual fundraisers for charity.

Combined with \$179,693 raised at the PLC's and American Loggers Council Annual Meetings the PLC raised \$287,691 for CMN hospitals in 2023.

"It is truly inspiring that despite the many challenges facing the Northeast's logging industry, PLC's Members, Supporting Members, friends, and families rallied once again in 2023 to raise a record amount for Children's Miracle Network hospitals," Doran, said. "No matter what the conditions in the industry are, this group always reaches deep for the kids and their families." The PLC plans to expand Log A Load efforts in Vermont in 2025.

#### Mechanized Logging Operations And Forest Trucking

The Mechanized Logging Operations and Forest Trucking Program (MLOFT) is now recruiting for its next class, scheduled to begin June 24 in Fairfield, Maine. The 20-week certificate program, which now includes Commercial Driver's License (CDL) training, is Maine's only post-secondary education program for operators of mechanized logging equipment. Approximately 95 percent of logging in Maine now relies on mechanized equipment and it generally takes at least a year of training before an operator becomes skilled enough to run this equipment safely and efficiently. The cost for companies to train these operators themselves is approximately \$100,000 per operator. The industry also relies almost exclusively on heavy trucks to move wood.

In the last decade, the logging industry realized the majority of its operators were approaching retirement age. The MLOFT (originally the Mechanized Logging Operations Program) program was created in 2017 by three Maine community colleges, the PLC, and industry partners including Milton CAT/CAT Forest Products, and United Construction and Forestry (Nortrax Inc.)/ John Deere to address this issue. In 2023, forest trucking was added to the program and the name changed to reflect this.

Today, demand for new workers in the logging industry is higher than ever and most students in the program continue to have job offers before graduating.

The program would not have been possible without the support of Maine's lawmakers, who made funding available for it through the "Put ME to Work Program' to support creation of new job training programs at Maine's community colleges.

The program includes a strong emphasis on safety as well as giving students an understanding of the variables of timber growth, tree species, and markets. Through a grant from the Harold Alfond Center of Advancement for Maine's Workforce and the Maine Jobs and Recovery Plan, students pay no tuition or fees, and the program provides all personal protective equipment (PPE).

Students also receive \$1,000 to help with living and traveling expenses thanks to a grant from Skowhegan Savings Bank. The program also received funding in 2023 through the Maine Jobs and Recovery Plan. This year it will receive funding from a federal grant secured by Maine Congressman Jared Golden.

In 2023, 12 students graduated from the program, an 86 percent completion rate. This year's class will be the 8th since its launch.

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The program continues to be possible thanks to the generous support of the industry partners named above as well as Davco, Pro-Pac, American Forest Management, Wallingford's, BBC Lands, Acadia Insurance, Haix, Skowhegan Savings Bank, Randall Madden Trucking, United Insurance, Katahdin Fire, Madden Timberlands, and Waratah.
